2. Discussion and Voting on Demands for Grants, 2021-2022.

(I) DEMAND NO. 10 - EDUCATION:

Shri Y. Joykumar Singh, Deputy Chief Minister (in-charge of Finance) to move :

“that a sum not exceeding Rs. 2555,27,87,000/- be granted to defray the charges which will come in course of payment during the financial year ending 31st March, 2022 in respect of Demand No. 10 - Education”.

MOTION FOR DISAPPROVAL OF POLICY CUT:

Km. Ak. Mirabai Devi, S/Shri Th. Lokeshwar Singh, D. Korunghang, K. Meghachandra Singh, Alfred Kannam Arthur and Surjakumar Okram, MLAs to move :-

“that the amount of the demand be reduced to Re. 1/-”

On account of :-

- (i) Lack of provision for safe & secure environment for girl students in the impending post Covid period.
- (ii) Lack of adequate budget provision & policy initiatives for girl students.
- (iii) Irregularities in transfer and posting of teachers.
- (iv) Non- transparency in payment (due amount) of completed civil works.
- (v) Inability to construct and maintain infrastructures (class rooms) of schools/colleges.
- (vi) Inability to streamline a general policy to make KGBVs and residential schools function in the same pattern as other residential schools.
- (vii) Irregularities in appointment of staff in the Council of Higher Secondary Education, Manipur in respect of its advertisement dated 5th November 2019.
- (viii) Ineffective implementation of centrally sponsored projects for Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan and Rastriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan which are now integrated as Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan.
- (ix) Inability to hold General Body meeting for SSA and RMSA (Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan) in the last 3-4 years and to decentralize the projects.
- (x) Inability to recruit the already sanctioned and vacant 4000 posts of teachers under SSA and RMSA (Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan).
- (xi) Inability to implement Right to Education Act, 2009 effectively.
- (xii) Arbitrary utilization of teachers.
- (xiii) Lack of an effective policy and irregularities in transfer and posting of teachers in “School Fagathanshi Mission”.
- (xiv) Inadequate and disproportionate allocation of teachers at Pettigrew college, Ukhrul.
- (xv) Inability to provide quality education and lack of a clear vision.
- (xvi) Inability to provide Library facilities in educational institutions.
