ITANAGAR, Sep 5: Emphasizing on proper knowledge and procedures of parliamentary affairs, Chief Minister Pema Khandu said training and orientation of members is necessary for democracy to thrive in its truest form.
While inaugurating a two-day orientation program here today for Members of the 7th Arunachal Pradesh Legislative Assembly on ways,

means and procedures of Legislative Assembly as well as on the National e-Vidhan Application (NeVA), Khandu urged all elected representatives to take advantage of the technical sessions and equip themselves to serve the people better.
He said the 7th Legislative Assembly of the state is one of the best in terms of elected members irrespective of party affiliations.

"I appreciate the people for sending educated, honest and energetic representatives to the Assembly. As members of this august house, we have great responsibilities of fulfilling the aspirations of our electorates," he pointed.
Reiterating his call to work as Team Arunachal, Khandu however said only sloganeering or verbal services won't suffice. He said all Members need to be equipped with best and latest technology and knowledge so that they can pro-actively participate in meaningful and positive proceedings of the legislative assembly.
"As every profession needs proper training to succeed, elected leaders too need proper training to deliver. Hence this orientation program," he said while expressing optimism that next session of the state legislative assembly

would witness a vast change in participation of its members.
Khandu also underscored the importance of digitalization of the state legislative assembly, for which the Govt of India has launched the National e-Vidhan Application.
"Once the state legislative assembly is digitalized and assembly sessions go paperless, think of the tons of papers that would be saved directly contributing to the state's exchequer and to the environment," he said.
He added that the state government through its Information Technology department has taken upon itself to make all its offices paperless by 2021, which he said, would bring in transparency, immediate disposal of files, save public money as well as contribute to the environment by checking. NEW DELHI, Sep 5 (UNI): CBI Special Judge Ajay Kumar Kuhar on Thursday remanded to judicial custody till September 19 former Union Finance Minister and Indian National Congress leader P Chidambaram in connection with the INX Media case and ordered that he be lodged in Tihar jail.
CBI registered an FIR in the month of May 2017 over alleged irregularities in the Foreign Investment Promotion Board clearance to INX Media to receive overseas funds of Rs. 305 crore in 2007, when Chidambaram was Finance Minister.
Central Bureau of Investigation arrested Chidambaram from his residence in New Delhi on August 21 and he was today produced in court.
Counsel for CBI moved an application for judicial custody of Chidambaram on the



grounds that if he is released on bail, he may tamper with evidence or influence the witnesses of the case.
Defence contended that Chidambaram may be released on bail as there is no such precedent that once police custody is over, judicial custody is required.
Judge Kuhar heard submissions from both the counsel before ordering to send Chidambaram to Tihar Jail till September 19 in connection with the INX Media case.
Chidambaram will follow his medicine and earn toilet in Tihar jail.
Judge also permitted Zority and separate cell bathroom in Tihar for Chidambaram.
On a day of swift judgments, Special Judge Saini earlier granted patory bail to Chidambaram and his son Karti in the Maxis case, which was stayed. (Contd.)

In his opening remarks, Speaker of the Arunachal Pradesh Legislative Assembly, P D Sona appreciated the attendance of almost all Members and assured that the program is not another run-of-the-mill training. "When the entire world has been summed up in our smartphones, we as people's representatives cannot remain illiterate....but become e-literate," he added while acknowledging the importance of the technical sessions on NeVA in the two-day program.

NeVA Project or Paperless Assembly or e-Assembly is a concept to enable automation of entire law making process, tracking of decisions and documents, sharing of information and bring all legislatures of the country together on one platform.

Through NeVA, Members would be able to handle diverse House Business smartly by putting entire information regarding member contact details, rules of procedure, list of business, notices, bulletins, bills, starred/unstarred questions and answers, papers laid, committee reports etc. in their hand-held devices/ tablets and equip all Legislatures/ Departments to handle it efficiently. Citizens would also gain access to this information at their fingertips.

The two-day program is being jointly organized by the Bureau of Parliamentary Studies & Training, Lok Sabha Secretariat and the Arunachal Pradesh Legislative Assembly Secretariat.

A team of six resources persons headed by Dr Satya Prakash, Joint Secretary, Union Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs, would be taking the technical sessions.
