AR News ITANAGAR, Sep 5: Emphasizing on proper knowledge and procedures of parliamen-tary affairs, Chief Minister Pema Khandu said training and orientation of members is necessary for democracy to thrive in its truest form.

While inaugurating a two day orientation program here today for Members of the 7th Arunachal Pradesh Leg-

He said the 7th Legislative Assembly of the state is one of the best in terms of elected members irrespective of party

"I appreciate the people for sending educated, honest and energetic representatives to the Assembly. As members of this august house, we have great responsibilities of fulfilling the aspirations of our electorates," he pointed.

Reiterating his call to work as Team Arunachal, Khandu however said only sloganeer-ing or verbal services won't suffice. He said all Members need to be equipped with best and latest technology and knowledge so that they can pro-actively participate in meaningful and positive proceedings of the legislative assembly.

"As every profession needs

proper training to succeed, elected leaders too need proper training to deliver. Hence this orientation program, he said while expressing op-timism that next session of the state legislative assembly

would witness a vast change in participation of its mem-

Khandu also underscored the importance of digitaliza-tion of the state legislative assembly, for which the Govt of India has launched the National e-Vidhan Application.

In his opening remarks, Speaker of the Arunachal Pradesh Legislative Assembly, P D Sona appreciated the attendance of almost all Members and assured that the program is not another run-of-the-mill training. At the end of the day, he said, Members would acquire the know-how and master the technology required in today's era to evolve as real representatives of the people.

"When the entire world has been summed up in our smartphones, we as people's representatives cannot remain illiterate....but become e-literate," he added while acknowledging the importance of the technical sessions on NeVA in the two-day program.

NeVA Project or Paperless Assembly or e-Assembly is a concept to enable automation of entire law making process, tracking of decisions and documents, sharing of information and bring all legislatures of the country together on one platform.

Through NeVA, Members would be able to handle diverse House Business smartly by putting entire information regarding member contact details, rules of procedure, list of business, notices, bulletins, bills, starred/unstarred questions and answers, papers laid, committee reports etc. in their hand-held devices/ tablets and equip all Legislatures/ Departments to handle it efficiently. Citizens would also gain access to this information at their fingertips.

The two-day program is being jointly organized by the Bureau of Parliamentary Studies & tariat.

A team of six resources persons headed by Dr Satya Prakash, Joint Secretary, Union Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs, would be taking the technical sessions.
