#### 4. OFFICIAL RESOLUTIONS

(1)

**A MINISTER to move-** “that WHEREAS, the Haryana Control of Organised Crime Bill, 2023 was passed by the State Legislature vide Bill No. 7-H.L.A. of 2023 to make special provisions for prevention and control of, and for coping with criminal activity by organised crime syndicate or gang and for matters connected therewith;

AND WHEREAS, the said Bill was presented to the Governor of Haryana in compliance of the provisions contained in article 200 of the Constitution of India for giving his assent thereto;

AND WHEREAS, the Governor of Haryana reserved the said Bill for the consideration of the President of India under article 201 of the Constitution of India;

AND WHEREAS, the Haryana Control of Organised Crime Bill, 2023 was sent to the Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs for assent of the President of India;

AND WHEREAS, on seeking comments of Ministry of Law and Justice and Ministry of Finance, Department of Revenue, Government of India by the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, certain discrepancies were found and Ministry of Home Affairs requested the State Government to consider withdrawing the said Bill and to submit a fresh Bill after duly incorporating the suggestions of the Legislative Department, Ministry of Law and Justice;

AND WHEREAS, the matter was deliberated upon and it was decided to request the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India to return the Haryana Control of

Organised Crime Bill, 2023, as the State of Haryana intends to introduce a revised Bill in view of the observations made by the Ministry of Finance, Department of Revenue, Government of India;

AND WHEREAS, the Council of Ministers has decided to withdraw the Haryana Control of Organised Crime Bill, 2023 (Bill No. 7-H.L.A. of 2023); Now, therefore, in pursuance of the provisions contained in articles 200 and 201 of the Constitution of India, the Legislative Assembly of the State of Haryana hereby resolves to withdraw the Haryana Control of Organised Crime Bill, 2023.”

**A MINISTER to move-** “that WHEREAS, the Haryana Honourable Disposal of Dead Body Bill, 2024 was passed by the State Legislature vide Bill No. 4-H.L.A. of 2024 to uphold the basic human rights of dead body and for the decent final disposal of dead body in the State of Haryana and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto;

AND WHEREAS, the said Bill was presented to the Governor of Haryana in compliance of the provisions contained in article 200 of the Constitution of India for giving his assent thereto;

AND WHEREAS, the Governor of Haryana reserved the said Bill for the consideration of the President of India under article 201 of the Constitution of India.

AND WHEREAS, the Haryana Honourable Disposal of Dead Body Bill, 2024 was sent to the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India for assent of the President of India. The Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India has sought the comments from the State Government on the observations raised by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare; Government of India received through the Secretary to Governor, Haryana. The matter was under consideration of State Government. In the meantime three new criminal laws namely the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 (Central Act 45 of 2023), the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (Central Act 46 of 2023) and the Bharatiya Sakshya Adhinyam, 2023 (Central Act 47 of 2023) were implemented from the 1st July, 2024 replacing the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (Central Act 45 of 1860), Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (Central Act 2 of 1974) and Indian Evidence Act, 1872 (Central Act 1 of 1872). Matter was deliberated upon and it was decided to request the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India to return the Haryana Honourable Disposal of Dead Body Bill, 2024, as the State of Haryana intends to send a fresh Bill after incorporating provisions enshrined in the newly enacted criminal laws as well as rectifying the observations of the Government of India.

And whereas, the Chief Minister, Haryana exercising the power of the Council of Ministers has decided to withdraw the Haryana Honourable Disposal of Dead Body Bill, 2024 (Bill No. 4-H.L.A. of 2024). Now, therefore, in pursuance of the provisions contained in articles 200 and 201 of the Constitution of India, the Legislative Assembly of the State of Haryana hereby resolves to withdraw the Haryana Honourable Disposal of Dead Body Bill, 2024.”
