I. Mr. M.Y Tarigami, Hon'ble MLA to move the following Cut Motions:-

1. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss separately school-wise the details of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) labs established with cost incurred in the district Kulgam for last two years.
2. I move a cut of Rs 100/-in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the details of schools being upgraded under PM-SHRI Yojna in the first phase indicating the details of special infrastructure provision for the same.
3. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss separately the reasons of delay in the regularization of the "Look After"principals, ZEOs, Lecturers, Headmasters for quite longtime despite frequent assurances from time to time.
4. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss separately the details of vacancies of principals, lecturers, ZEOS, HMs, Masters and teachers in +2 schools, High Schools, Middle Schools and Primary Schools and the measures afoot to fill up these vacancies with special reference to Kulgam district.
5. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the details of the educational institutions without government accommodation and Insufficient accommodation in Kulgam constituency and the measures taken to provide the accommodation on fast track under SAMAGRA programme.

II. Mr. Balwant Sing Mankotia, Hon'ble MLA to move the following Cut Motions:-

1. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the inordinate delay in releasing of funds for the construction of various school buildings including HSS Datti which has got fully damaged due to last year floods.
2. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the details of the transfers of Principals, Head Masters, Masters, Teachers & non Teaching Staff in Different Schools of District Udhampur and name of authority who recommended for these transfers.
3. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the need for enhancement of monthly honorarium of the cooks engaged in various schools of the J&K.
4. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the inordinate delay in providing of adequate staff & creation of posts in various hanging schools of J&K including H.S. Nalla Ghoura, H. S. Charat in Chenani Constituency.

5. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the reasons of delay in filling up of the vacant post of Principals, Head Masters & non-Teaching Staff in various educational institutions of Chenani constituency.

III. Mr. Sajad Gani Lone, Hon'ble MLA to move the following Cut Motions:-

1. I move a cut of Rs.100 in Demand No. 7 in order to discuss the need for de-freezing the recruitment of General Line Teachers in Jammu & Kashmir.
2. I move a cut of Rs.100 in Demand No. 7 in order to discuss the inordinate delay in the appointment of a full-time Chairman of the Board of School Education and Director of the State Council for Education Research & Training.
3. I move a Cut of Rs.100 in Demand No. 7 in order to discuss the need for formulating a transfer policy for regularised Rehbar-e-Taleem teachers.

IV. Mr. Mir Mohammad Fayaz, Hon'ble MLA to move the following Cut Motions

1. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the acute deficiency of teaching staff in Kupwara constituency, particularly in the areas of Kalaroos, Hayhama and Awoora.
2. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss desirability for up-gradation of High School Awoora, Gulgam, Monigah and Manzhar to the level of Higher Secondary level which fulfill the requisite norms and cater to a large student population.
3. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the acute shortage of accommodation in High School Awoora and High School Batapora, where enrolment is significantly high and the need for providing of additional accommodation to these institutions."

V. Dr. Devinder Kumar Manyal, Hon'ble MLA to move the following Cut Motions:-

1. I move a cut of Rs.100 in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the reasons for persistently low enrolment in Government schools and the concrete, time-bound action plan of the Government to increase enrolment.
2. I move a cut of Rs.100 in Demand No. 7 in order to discuss the steps taken by the Government to address the imbalance in teacher-student ratio, presence of surplus teachers in low-enrolment schools, shortage of teachers in high-enrolment schools, and the policy of the Government on merger of schools and rationalization.
3. I move a cut of Rs.100 in Demand No.7 in order to discuss whether the Government has a clear, monitored plan to improve school infrastructure, ensure quality construction as per safety standards, and fix accountability for delays and substandard works.
4. I move a cut of Rs.100 in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the regularization policy for Vocational Teachers and Contractual Lecturers and the need for the enhancement in their salaries.
5. I move a cut of Rs.100 in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the proposal for establishing new Navodaya Vidyalayas, Kendriya Vidyalayas and other Central schools in District Samba particularly in Ramgarh Constituency and the criteria adopted for their location indicating also the reasons of delay or non-sanctioning of such schools in deserving areas.

VI. Mr. R.S Pathania, Hon'ble MLA to move the following Cut Motions:-

1. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss allocation of ₹12,014.89 crore despite more than 3,000 primary schools lacking functional toilets and basic infrastructure.

2. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss prioritisation of 600 ICT labs and 2,000 smart classrooms in areas with erratic electricity and weak internet connectivity.
3. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss decline in foundational literacy and numeracy outcomes despite total education outlay exceeding Rs.15,000 crore.
4. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss transparency in textbook printing and tendering under JKBOSE and financial burden on parents due to private publisher practices.
5. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss strengthening of Sanskrit education as a measure for preservation of heritage and linguistic diversity.

VII. Mr. Pawan Kumar Gupta, Hon'ble MLA to move the following Cut Motions:-

1. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss subject-wise sanctioned strength of Principals, Headmasters, Senior Lecturers, Lecturers, Masters, General Line Teachers and ministerial staff in the department with particular reference to Udhampur West Constituency and the steps being taken by the Government to provide adequate staff in each category.
2. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the desirability of introducing Yoga classes under the Sports and Youth Services schemes, as well as professional training for students of classes VIII to XII in different skills, thereby creating self-employment opportunities for youth passing out of higher secondary classes.
3. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the necessity of constructing/providing adequate school buildings in the Udhampur West Constituency wherever such structures have not been provided till date or have suffered damages during the recent natural calamities in August–September 2025.
4. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the introduction of specific subjects such as Sanskrit, Sociology, Commerce, Computer Science, and Information Technology in various schools where these subjects have not yet been introduced in 10+2 classes, along with the creation and appointment of the required teaching staff.
5. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the desirability of appointing Cluster Resource Coordinators under SAMAGRA after a proper selection process, with well-qualified candidates holding higher qualifications such as PhDs, NET, and PG degrees in the required subjects.

VIII. Mr. Shakti Raj Parihar, Hon'ble MLA to move the following Cut Motions:-

1. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand no.7 in order to discuss the need for upgradation of schools in Doda-West constituency that meet the eligibility criteria.
2. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No. 7 in order to discuss the immediate filling up of vacant posts in upgraded schools and the details of "hanging schools" awaiting post-sanction, so that the functioning of such institutions is streamlined and quality education is ensured.
3. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No. 7 in order to discuss the disparity in grant of time-bound benefits to JKPSA-recruited Lecturers as some are being granted promotions/benefits while others are being denied the same, causing discrimination and affecting the morale of teaching staff.

4. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No. 7 in order to discuss the long pending DPC for Incharge Lecturers across various subjects in the Education Department together-with the expected timeline for its completion, indicating also the reasons of delay in granting of subsequent time-bound benefits.
5. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the reasons for non conducting of DPC and denial of promotion of 221 candidates (Head Assistants, Senior Assistants & Junior Assistants) of Jammu division despite of their SATC qualification.

IX. Mr. Rafiq Ahmad Naik, Hon'ble MLA to move the following Cut Motions:-

1. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss infrastructure status of government schools in Tral Constituency, including availability of classrooms, toilets, drinking water and boundary walls.
2. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the shortage of teaching staff and subject-specific teachers in middle and secondary schools of Tral Constituency.
3. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the reasons of discontinuation of Commerce stream admissions in Boys Higher Secondary School, Tral, which had been operational since 2018, and to ascertain responsibility for stopping admissions after six years without providing any alternative arrangements for affected students.
4. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the desirability for upgradation of schools to next level including schools at Jawahirpora, Midoora, Awantipura, Machama, Chewa in Tral Constituency and the need for framing up of regularization policy for DEOs, JES, AES, Orderlies, and Auditors engaged on contractual basis for over two decades under SSA, RMSA, and now Samagra Shiksha, despite their continuous service, while Rehbar-e-Taleem teachers under SSA were regularized after five years.
5. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the need for implementation of digital education initiatives, including smart classrooms and internet connectivity in schools of Tral Constituency.

X. Mr. Waheed Ur Rehman Para, Hon'ble MLA to move the following Cut Motions:-

1. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the reported removal of Lal Ded and Sheikh-ul-Alam curriculum from school textbooks in Jammu and Kashmir, whether the government proposes to restore their teachings in the school curriculum, and the measures being taken to preserve and promote their spiritual, cultural, and literary legacy for future generations.
2. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No. 7 in order to discuss the district-wise details of total number of Government and private schools functioning in Jammu and Kashmir indicating the the number of schools affiliated with the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) from last 2 years, and the steps being taken by the government to ensure proper regulation, infrastructure, and quality education across all districts.
3. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No. 7 in order to discuss the measures being undertaken by the Government for the revival and promotion of the Kashmiri language, the policies introduced to preserve its cultural and literary heritage, steps taken to encourage its use in educational institutions and official communications, and the roadmap for ensuring its sustained growth across the Union Territory.

4. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the category-wise and district-wise, the total number of vacant posts in the School Education Department across Jammu and Kashmir, including Lecturers, Headmasters, Zonal Education Officers (ZEOs), and Higher Secondary School Principals together-with the reasons for non filling up of 3,720 Lecturer posts (about 1,800 in Kashmir and 1,920 in Jammu), 545 Headmaster posts, 60 ZEO posts, and 50 Higher Secondary Principal posts, resulting in resorting to temporary arrangements such as deployment of elementary teachers and Cluster Resource Coordinators;
5. I move a cut of Rs.100/-in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the reasons for not advertising these vacancies for regular recruitment despite the acute shortage of teaching and academic staff in schools and also the steps taken for immediate advertising of these vacant posts.


XI. Mr. Mohan Lal Bhagat, Hon'ble MLA to move the following Cut Motions:-

1. I move a cut of Rs.100 in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the non-availability of adequate and functional toilet facilities for girl students in several government schools of Akhnoor Constituency.
2. I move a cut of Rs.100 in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the condition of government school buildings damaged during floods where no funds have been provided for repair or reconstruction.
3. I move a cut of Rs.100 in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the shortage of subject teachers in middle, high and higher secondary schools of Akhnoor.
4. I move a cut of Rs.100 in Demand No.7 in order to discuss the lack of boundary walls, classrooms, drinking water and other basic facilities in rural government schools.

1. I move a cut of Rs. 100/- in demand No.17 in order to discuss the need for creation of PHC at Ashmuji, Kulgam, a centrally located area of about 25000 population and provision of funds for construction of building for NTPHC at Sonigam, Kulgam.
2. I move a cut of Rs. 100/- in demand No.17 in order to discuss the need for bringing at par the doctors and para-medicos engaged under NHM in J&K in respect of remuneration with that of all India level including Ladakh.
3. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in demand No.17 in order to discuss separately the district-wise details of health institutions functional in the UT upto date.
4. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in demand No.17 in order to discuss separately the district-wise details of creation of PHCs/NTPHCs/Health and Sub-centres in the UT during the last three years.

3. I move a cut of Rs. 100/- in Demand No. 17 in order to discuss the date for shifting of PHC Payerpora in Kupwara Constituency to the newly constructed building, so that the healthcare services may be provided to the public in a proper and improved manner.

1. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No 17 in order to discuss the lack of healthcare facilities in border areas, unsafe condition of the hospital building of PHC Bainglar in Ramgarh Assembly Constituency and hospitals functioning in Panchayat/private buildings.
2. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No 17 in order to discuss the disparity in salaries of NHM employees in Jammu & Kashmir as compared to other States/UTs, and the steps taken by the Government to bring their salaries at par with their counterparts in other States and Union Territories.
3. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No 17 in order to discuss the total sanctioned strength, existing vacancies of doctors and paramedical staff in DHs, SDHs, and PHCs in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir and the steps taken to fill the vacancies.
4. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No. 17 in order to discuss the proposal of the Government for establishing new AAMs and for strengthening the health infrastructure in Ramgarh Constituency.
5. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.17 in order to discuss the need for enhancement in honorarium of ASHA workers and the proposal for their regularization.

VI. Mr. R.S Pathania, Hon'ble MLA to move the following Cut Motions:-

1. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No. 17 in order to discuss nearly 40% vacancy of specialists in peripheral district hospitals despite expansion to 17 medical colleges.
2. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.17 in order to discuss failure to implement an effective rural service bond and incentive mechanism for MBBS and PG graduates of Government Medical Colleges.
3. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.17 in order to discuss continued referral of over 25% trauma and critical cases to private facilities despite ₹124 crore allocation for diagnostic upgrades due to non-availability of technicians.

4. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.17 in order to discuss persistently high out-of-pocket expenditure of approximately 39% in Jammu & Kashmir despite allocation of Rs.8,813.71 crore to the sector.
5. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.17 in order to discuss the absence of a centralized oncology procurement policy to ensure uniform availability of chemotherapy and immunotherapy drugs across major Government institutions.

VII. Mr. Pawan Kumar Gupta, Hon'ble MLA to move the following Cut Motions:-

1. I move a cut of Rs. 100/- in Demand No.17 in order to discuss the steps taken by the Government Medical College Udhampur for taking over its adjoining assets of ITI College Udhampur after payment of the assessed depreciated cost of such buildings/structures valued to the order of Rs. 6 crore, especially in the circumstances when the appropriate land for shifting of said ITI College has been identified at Patwar Sansoo.
2. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.17 in order to discuss subject-wise the sanctioned strength of Professors, Associate Professors, Assistant Professors, Consultants, Medical Officers, and Paramedical staff against the available vacancies in the GMC Udhampur
3. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.17 in order to discuss non-functioning of ICU, CCU, and Cath Lab despite procurement of required machinery by the department which is being rusted in absence of appropriate staff well trained on the said subjects.
4. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No. 17 in order to discuss acute staff shortages and poor functioning of academic arrangement doctors (Registrars/Sr.Residents) in Medical College Udhampur, affecting round-the-clock emergency services and the steps being taken to provide full strength of all categories of staff and deployment of appropriate machinery to keep a proper check on its functioning and due performance of all such staff so engaged round the clock indicating also the delay in filling-up of vacant doctor and Class-IV posts, sweepers and other non technical staff in all sub-district hospitals/dispensaries in Udhampur West Assembly Constituency.
5. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No. 17 in order to discuss the status and reasons of delay in creation of a new 182-bedded Bone and Joint Hospital at Bakshi Nagar, Jammu, as proposed by the Principal and Dean of Medical College Jammu, as a result of which the public at large wholly dependent on this hospital across the Jammu region has been deprived of such facilities till date.

VIII. Mr. Shakti Raj Parihar, Hon'ble MLA to move the following Cut Motions:-

1. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No. 17 in order to discuss the issue of non-gazetted staff in new GMCs who are deprived of service rules, promotions, and time-bound promotion benefits.

IX. Mr. Rafiq Ahmad Naik, Hon'ble MLA to move the following Cut Motions:-

1. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.17 in order to discuss the functioning of health institutions in Tral Constituency, including Sub-Centres, Primary Health Centres, and the Sub-District Hospital, with respect to staff strength, infrastructure, and availability of essential medicines.
2. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.17 in order to discuss the shortage of doctors, paramedical staff, and specialists in health Institutions of Tral Constituency and the steps being taken to fill these vacancies.

3. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.17 in order to discuss the contradictory official positions regarding the status of Tral Hospital being termed both SDH and CHC, leading to denial of upgraded services.

2. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.17 in order to discuss the details of financial and medical assistance being provided to poor and economically weaker patients for specialised and life-saving treatments from last 2 years especially assistance received by patients of District Pulwama.
3. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.17 in order to discuss the present availability and proposed installation of MRI, PET Scan, and X-ray facilities in Pulwama district; and the status of the proposed Pulwama Maternity Hospital indicating the details of infrastructure and manpower;
4. I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.17 in order to discuss the present status of the proposed Medical University and SKIMS Cancer Institute in the Union Territory as also the current status, phase-wise progress, and expected timelines for completion of AIIMS project in Awantipora Pulwama.

I move a cut of Rs.100/- in Demand No.17 in order to discuss the long-pending issues of employees working under the National Health Mission (NHM), including lack of job security, non-regularization, absence of service bylaws, salary disparity, and denial of social security benefits like EPF and post-retirement assistance? And If not, the reasons for the inordinate delay, and the time-frame by which the Government proposes to grant regularization, salary hike for 2024-25, formulation of service bylaws, and extension of EPF and retirement benefits to all eligible NHM employees?






