The details of major Schemes/Projects of Ministry of Health & Family Welfare being implemented in the country along with details of funds State/UT wise are given as under:

**1. National Health Mission**

- The National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) was launched in 2005 to provide accessible, affordable and quality health care to the rural population especially the vulnerable sections. One of the key features of NRHM includes interventions for improving health indicators. The NRHM was subsumed under the National Health Mission (NHM) as its sub-mission, along with National Urban Health Mission (NUHM) as other sub-mission in 2013.
- Under NHM, technical and financial support is provided to States/UTs for health system strengthening including support for physical infrastructure, health human resource, ambulances, Free Drugs & Diagnostic, PM National Dialysis Programme, Quality Assurance, Health & Wellness Centres etc.
- Financial allocation is tentative one and after the closure of the financial year release matters. Therefore, the information on State-wise central release and expenditure (Centre + State) for the last three years i.e. from the FY 2015-16 to 2017-18 under National Health Mission is as under:

National Urban Health Mission (NUHM) was approved by the Cabinet on 1<sup>st</sup> May, 2013 as a sub-mission under an overarching National Health Mission (NHM) for providing equitable and quality primary health care services to urban population with focus on slum and vulnerable sections of the Society.

### **3. Medical Education**

#### **3.1 Establishment of new Medical Colleges attached with existing district/referral hospitals:-**

##### **PHASE-1**

The total cost of establishment of one Medical College under the scheme is Rs.189 crore. 58 districts in 20 States/UT have been identified under this Scheme. Out of these, 57 have been approved till date. Funds to the tune of Rs.6281.70 crore have been released to the State/UT Governments for the approved districts under the Scheme. Out of 57 approved medical colleges, 19 have become functional. Details of fund released States/UTs wise at **Table-I**.

##### **PHASE-II**

The total cost of establishment of one Medical College under the scheme is Rs.250 crore. The objective is to ensure the availability of one medical college for every 3 Parliamentary Constituencies and at least 1 Government Medical College in every State of the country. 24 new medical colleges in 8 States/UT have been identified under this Scheme. Out of these, 12 Medical Colleges have been approved as on 03.07.2018. Funds to the tune of Rs.600 crore have been released to the State/UT Governments for the approved districts under the Scheme. #### **3.2 Up-gradation of existing State Government/Central Government medical colleges to increase MBBS seats in the country:**

With the objective of creating 10,000 MBBS seats in Government Colleges in the country, the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare is implementing Centrally Sponsored Scheme for Up-gradation of existing State Government/Central Government medical colleges to increase MBBS seats. 36 Medical Colleges have been approved under the scheme to increase 2615 UG seats. Funds to the tune of Rs.1228.30 crore have been released to the State Governments till date under this Scheme. Details of fund released States/UTs wise at **Table-III**.

#### **3.3 Strengthening and up-gradation of State Government Medical colleges for starting new PG disciplines and increasing PG seats:-**

##### **Phase-I**

The Phase-I of the scheme was launched in the XI Plan period with the objective to strengthen and upgrade State/Central Government Medical Colleges to create new PG seats. A total of 72 Government Medical colleges in 21 States/UTs have been approved under the scheme for increasing 4058 PG seats. Funds to the tune of Rs.988.99 crore have been released under the scheme till date. Details of fund released States/UTs wise at **Table-IV**.

## **Phase-II**

With the objective of creating 4000 PG seats in Government Colleges in the country, the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare is implementing Phase-II of the Centrally Sponsored Scheme for Up-gradation of existing State Government/Central Government medical colleges to increase PG seats.

**5. Strengthening of Tertiary Care Cancer facilities” scheme of National Programme for Prevention and Control of Cancer, Diabetes, Cardiovascular Diseases and Stroke (NPCDCS)**

Under “Strengthening of Tertiary Care Cancer facilities” scheme of National Programme for Prevention and Control of Cancer, Diabetes, Cardiovascular Diseases and Stroke (NPCDCS), Government of India provides financial assistance for setting up of State Cancer Institutes (SCI) and Tertiary Care Cancer Centres (TCCC) in different parts of the country. The maximum permissible assistance for SCI is Rs. 120 crores and for TCCC is Rs. 45 crores, which includes State share of 40%, except for North-Eastern and Himalayan States where the State share is 10%. The State/UT wise details of funds released under the scheme so far, including Karnataka is as under:

## **PART (b):**

District Level Household and Facility Survey (DLHS-3) (2007-08) and DLHS-4 (2012-13) undertaken by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare through the nodal agency International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS) inter-alia provides data on Health Facilities. Details are given at **Annexure-I**.

## **PART (c):**

As on 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2017, there are a total 10,62,398 allopathic doctors registered with the State Medical Councils/ Medical Council of India (MCI). Assuming 80% availability, it is estimated that around 8.50 lakh doctors may be actually available for active service. It gives a doctor-population ratio of 1:1565 as per current population estimate of 1.33 billion. Besides, there are 7,73,668 registered practitioners of AYUSH in the country and 6.19 lakh AYUSH practitioners may be in active service on assuming their 80% availability. If the allopathic and AYUSH streams are considered together, it gives a doctor population ratio of 1:905, which is better than the WHO norms.

## **PART (d):**

The Government has taken various steps to increase the number of doctors in the country. This includes:

- (i) The ratio of teachers to students has been revised from 1:1 to 1:2 for all MD/MS disciplines and 1:1 to 1:3 in subjects of Anaesthesiology, Forensic Medicine, Radiotherapy, Medical Oncology, Surgical Oncology and Psychiatry. Further, teacher: student ratio in public funded Government Medical Colleges for Professor has been increased from 1:2 to 1:3 in all clinical subjects and for Associate Professor from 1:1 to 1:2 if the Associate Professor is a unit head. The same has also been extended to the private medical colleges with the conditions that it should be a standing of 15 years, running PG courses since 10 years, should have completed at least 1 continuance of recognition assessment satisfactorily and applies u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for increase of seats. This would result in increase in number of PG seats in the country.
- (ii) DNB qualification has been recognized for appointment as faculty to take care of shortage of faculty.
- (iii) Enhancement of maximum intake capacity at MBBS level from 150 to 250.
- (iv) Relaxation in the norms of setting up of Medical College in terms of requirement for faculty, staff, bed/bed strength and other infrastructure.
- (v) Requirement of land for establishment of medical college in metropolitan cities as notified under Article 243P(c) of the Constitution of India has been dispensed with.

- (vi) Strengthening/upgradation of State Government Medical Colleges for starting new PG courses/Increase of PG seats.
- (vii) Establishment of New Medical Colleges by upgrading district/referral hospitals preferably in underserved districts of the country.
- (viii) Strengthening/ upgradation of existing State Government/Central Government Medical Colleges to increase MBBS seats.
- (ix) Enhancement of age limit for appointment/ extension/ re-employment against posts of teachers/dean/principal/ director in medical colleges from 65-70 years.

Further, to encourage doctors working in remote and difficult areas, the MCI with the previous approval of Central Government, has amended the Post Graduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 to provide:

- (i) 50% of the seats in Post Graduate Diploma Courses shall be reserved for Medical Officers in the Government service, who have served for at least three years in remote and/or difficult and/or rural areas. After acquiring the PG Diploma, the Medical Officers shall serve for two more years in remote and/or difficult and/or rural areas; and
- (ii) Incentive at the rate of 10% of the marks obtained for each year in service in remote and/or difficult or rural areas as upto the maximum of 30% of the marks obtained in the entrance test for admissions in Post Graduate Medical Courses.
