**Will the MINISTER of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP  
be pleased to state:**

- (a) whether the Government proposes to set up network of institutes for Skill Development in various States, especially in backward areas of Rajasthan;
- (b) if so, the details thereof including the action plan being prepared along with the proposed training modules for the purpose;
- (c) the amount spent for skill development and entrepreneurship during 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017-18, year-wise;
- (d) the sectors in which the persons trained during the said years were provided opportunities of employment; and
- (e) whether the Government is also providing funds to the States for skill development and if so, the details thereof, State-wise?

**STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) to (e) of LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 172 TO BE ANSWERED ON 30.07.2018 ASKED BY SHRI JAI PRAKASH NARAYAN YADAV: DR. BHARATIBEN D. SHYAL REGARDING 'SKILL DEVELOPMENT**

**(a) to (e)** The Government of India has launched an initiative for transformation of identified Aspirational Districts which rank poorly in important social indicators like health & nutrition, education, agriculture & water resources, financial inclusion & skill formation and basic infrastructure. Five districts of Rajasthan have been identified as aspirational districts namely, Baran, Jaisalmer, Dholpur, Karauli and Sirohi.

In order to bring the aspirational districts at par with other districts in terms of skill development, a Master Plan has been prepared listing the strategies of the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship to achieve the goals towards the transformation of these districts. The strategy, inter alia, includes providing training infrastructure in districts which currently do not have such facilities, formation of district action plans, providing counselling facilities at Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Kendras (PMKKs), organising job fairs, facilitating loans for trained candidates through Mudra Scheme, etc.

To strengthen the training infrastructure, the Government is promoting Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Kendras (PMKKs) as model skill centres in every district. As on date, 613 PMKKs have been allocated covering 548 districts, of which 462 have been established. Of the five aspirational districts of Rajasthan, PMKKs are operational in Jaisalmer and Baran while in Dholpur and Karauli PMKKs are expected to be operationalized by September, 2018 and in Sirohi by January, 2019.

Under the Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), a flagship outcome-based skill training scheme of the Ministry, short term training is imparted to provide employable skills to the youth to access better employment opportunities. Presently, there are 7213 PMKVY training centres across the country providing training in sectors like agriculture, construction, automotive, retail, food processing, beauty & wellness, etc. Of these training centres, 33 are in aspirational districts of Rajasthan.

Long term training is imparted through Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) in 127 trades like Electrician, Fitter, Machinist, Welder, Mechanic Motor Vehicle, etc. There are 14295 ITIs (2187 Government and 12108 Private) of which 149 are in aspirational districts of Rajasthan.

The Ministry has spent a total of 991.15 crore, 1521.94 crore and 2149.95 crore in the year 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017-18 respectively, on skill development and entrepreneurship programmes. The Government has modified the guidelines for PMKVY 2.0 (2016-2020) to involve State Governments in implementation of the programme. It now has two components known as Centrally Sponsored Centrally Managed (CSCM), being implemented by National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) and Centrally Sponsored State Managed (CSSM), being implemented by State Skill Development Missions of the States/ UTs. State-wise details of physical and financial allocation, approved in-principle, and funds disbursed under CSSM component so far are at Annexure.
