(a) & (b): Considering present trend in monthly collection of GST revenue the changes in Revised Estimates vis-à-vis Budget Estimates for the FY 2018-19 are as under:

It is further submitted that the month-wise gross collection of Central Goods and Services Tax (CGST), State Goods and Services Tax (SGST), Integrated Goods and Services Tax (IGST) and Cess for FY 2017-18 and FY 2018-19 are as under:

The average gross collection of GST in the current FY 2018-19 is Rs. 97,555 crores (till January'19) as compared to last year average collection of Rs. 89885 crores.
