**REVENUE EARNINGS UNDER GST**

**\*319. SHRI KULDEEP RAI SHARMA:**

Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

(a) the details of revenue earnings under the Goods and Services Tax (GST) since its implementation, month-wise;

(b) the details of revenue earnings one year prior to introduction of GST, month-wise;

(c) the details of GST to be paid and already paid to various States/UTs including the Andaman and Nicobar Islands since implementation of GST, month and State/UT-wise;

(d) whether it is a fact that GST compensation has gone up during the last few years and if so, the details thereof;

(e) whether the States/UTs are losing revenue due to GST; and

(f) if so, the manner in which the Government is planning to go ahead in this regard to shore up GST revenue?

(a) The month-wise gross collection of Goods and Services Tax (GST) for FY 2017-18, FY 2018-19 and FY 2019-20 are as under:

It is clear from the above table that the average gross GST collection in the FY 2018-19 has been Rs. 98,114 crores which is higher than the previous year's average gross GST collection of Rs. 89,885 crores.

(c) The details of total GST accrued to States/UTs including SGST and IGST Settlement (Regular & Provisional) month-wise and State-wise are as given in **Annexure.**

(d) The details of compensation released to the States including UTs of Delhi and Puducherry after implementation of GST w.e.f. 01.07.2017 are as per details given below: -

(e) & (f) The total GST collection of the States/UTs for the year 2018-19 is Rs. 518447 crores against GST collection Rs. 291100 crores in the FY 2017-18(only Aug'17 to Mar'2018). The GST collection of the States/UTs has been showing steady improvement over the period of time. In addition, they are also assured a growth of 14% for a period of five years through payment of compensation by the Central Government.

Concerted efforts have been made to improve tax compliance. Extensive automation of business processes, application of e-way bill mechanism, targeted action on compliance verification, enforcement based on risk assessment and proposed introduction of electronic invoice system are the steps taken for increasing the revenue collection.

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
