13. FURTHER DISCUSSION on the following resolution moved by Shri Kunwar Pushpendra Singh Chandel on the 21st June, 2019 :-

"Having regard to the fact that due to scarcity of water and unavailability of fodder for cattle in the Bundelkhand region of the State of Uttar Pradesh, the people of the region are forced to leave their cows to graze in the open, which is popularly known as `Anna Pratha', and which causes damage to the standing crops, this House urges upon the Government to take steps to construct a network of canals from the proposed Ken-Betwa river-linking project in order to inter-connect and replenish the dams and ponds to overcome the problem of water scarcity and practice of *Anna Pratha* in the region."

Construction of canals through Ken-Betwa river-linking project to overcome the problem of water scarcity and stray cows in the Bundelkhand region.

14. SHRI SUSHIL KUMAR SINGH to move :-

"This House urges upon the Government to bring forward a suitable legislation to enable the undertrial prisoners, who are lodged in jails but have not yet been convicted, to exercise their right to vote during the elections to the House of the People and the Legislative Assemblies of the States."

Suitable legislation to accord right of voting to the prisoners who are not yet been convicted.

15. SHRI T.N. PRATHAPAN to move :-

"Keeping in view that-

- (i) agrarian sector is in a crisis;
- (ii) unemployment is increasing;
- (iii) poverty is deeply rooted in the society;
- (iv) public education sector is lacking funds;
- (v) public sector is increasingly being privatised;
