RESOLUTIONS

21. FURTHER DISCUSSION on the following resolution moved by Shri Raghav Lakhanpal on the 22nd December, 2017 :-

"This House expresses its grave concern over the Implementation of a stringent population control policy. population explosion in our country, which, if not taken care of, would lead to demographic catastrophe in the next fifty years, and urges upon the Government to implement a stringent policy aiming at population control at the earliest."

22. SHRIMATI RAMA DEVI to move :-

"In order to ensure balanced development of the country, this House urges upon the Government to take the following immediate steps for development of the rural and the backward areas-

Immediate steps for development of the rural and backward areas.

(i) prevent migration of people from rural areas to urban areas;

(ii) provide similar facilities to the people residing in rural areas as are available to people of urban areas;

(iii) promote and speed up industrial development in backward areas;

(iv) develop basic infrastructural facilities in rural areas; and

(v) establish industries in resource rich backward areas."

23. SHRI SUNIL KUMAR SINGH to move :-

"Having regard to the problems being faced by people in the State of Jharkhand and neighbouring States on account of inadequate means of transportation, particularly rail connectivity, this House urges upon the Government to take immediate steps –

Allocation of adequate funds for railway connectivity in the State of Jharkhand.

(i) for laying proposed railway lines in order to provide rail connectivity between the State of Jharkhand and other parts of the country;

(ii) for having discussion on contribution by the State in the railway revenue separately by the passenger trains and goods trains;

(iii) for early completion of railway line project between Chatra and Gaya;

(iv) for starting work on proposed railway line between Barwadih and Chirimiri by allocating adequate funds;

(v) for ensuring rail connectivity between Chatra and Shivpur by completing the missing rail link between these stations;

(vi) to expedite the work of Chatra -Tori railway line project by way of allocation of adequate funds and expediting the project work;

(vii) to establish a railway zone in the State of Jharkhand as there are only railway divisional headquarters located at Dhanbad, Chakradharpur, Adra and Ranchi in the State;

(viii) to include Bokaro under Ranchi or Dhanbad railway division which at present is in Adra division or establish a new railway division at Bokaro."

24. SHRI BHAIROON PRASAD MISHRA to move :-

"Having regard to the fact that the farmers of the Bundelkhand region of the State of Uttar Pradesh are living in pitiable conditions due to low agricultural yield, inadequate irrigation facility and inconsistency in criteria of determining land holding of small and marginal farmers of the region in comparison to other parts of the State, this House urges upon the Government to formulate effective scheme for the welfare of the small and marginal farmers of the Bundelkhand region."
