**RESOLUTIONS**

**15. FURTHER DISCUSSION** on the following resolution moved by Shri Kunwar Pushpendra Singh Chandel on the 21<sup>st</sup> June, 2019:-

"Having regard to the fact that due to scarcity of water and unavailability of fodder for cattle in the Bundelkhand region of the State of Uttar Pradesh, the people of the region are forced to leave their cows to graze in the open, which is popularly known as `Anna Pratha', and which causes damage to the standing crops, this House urges upon the Government to take steps to construct a network of canals from the proposed Ken-Betwa river-linking project in order to inter-connect and replenish the dams and ponds to overcome the problem of water scarcity and practice of *Anna Pratha* in the region."

*Construction of canals through Ken-Betwa river-linking project to overcome the problem of water scarcity and stray cows in the Bundelkhand region.*

**16. SHRI BHANU PRATAP SINGH VERMA** to move:-

"Having regard to the fact that the farmers of the Bundelkhand region in the State of Uttar Pradesh have inadequate irrigation facilities,

*Formulation of more effective schemes for the welfare of small and*

low agricultural yield in comparison to other parts of the State and inconsistency in land holdings, this House urges upon the Government to formulate a more effective scheme for the welfare of the small and marginal farmers of the Bundelkhand region." *marginal farmers of the Bundelkhand region in the State of Uttar Pradesh.*

**17. SHRI AJAY NISHAD** to move :-

"Having regard to the fact that -

(i) increasing population in the country is making our natural resources scarce;

(ii) our population is increasing at the rate of nineteen per cent. per year which is equivalent to the population of Australia and will surpass China in terms of population by the year 2024;

(iii) increasing population is the root cause of all the problems like unemployment, malnutrition, etc. which our country is facing;

(iv) timely and swift action is required to be taken to deal with this grave situation; and

(v) most of the developing countries of the world have succeeded in controlling their population and are now making all round development at rapid pace,

this House urges upon the Government to bring forward a suitable legislation to control the population in the country to ensure overall development of the nation."

**18. MS. ANNPURNA DEVI** to move :-

"In view of the continuous drought conditions in many parts of the country, this House recommends to the Government to-

Measures for utilisation of water resources.

(i) prepare a plan for utilising ground water as well as river water for irrigation purposes;

(ii) formulate a time-bound programme for the completion of all major pending irrigation projects; and

(iii) sanction new irrigation projects and provide financial assistance to the concerned State Governments to take up and complete them within a stipulated period."

**19. DR. SUBHAS SARKAR** to move :-

"Considering the extreme socio-economic backwardness of the Jangal Mahal region in the State of West Bengal, this House urges upon the Government to take immediate steps to formulate and implement a special centrally sponsored economic development scheme to ensure all-round development and welfare of the people living in that region."
