6. SYNOPSIS OF BILLS PASSED BY THE VIDHAN SABHA

1. The Indian Stamp (Punjab Second Amendment) Bill, 2025.

(Introduced and passed on the 30th December, 2025)

This Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act, in order to enhance the ease of doing business in the State by eliminating the duplication of stamp duty on the same loan transaction and by prescribing a single, capped levy on the total loan amount. This measure will simplify compliance, reduce transaction costs, and facilitate smoother access to credit for businesses, particularly MSMEs, thereby supporting industrial development and economic growth in the State.

2. The Punjab Abadi Deh (Record of Rights) Amendment Bill, 2025.

(Introduced and passed on the 30th December, 2025)

This Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act, so as to reduce time limits for filing objections and for decision of appeals in order to ensure the timely implementation of the SVAMITVA/ Mera Ghar Mere Naam Scheme.

3. The Punjab Land Revenue (Amendment) Bill, 2025

(Introduced and passed on the 30th December, 2025)

This Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act, in order to expedite the disposal of court cases pending before the various revenue authorities and provide sanctity to the digital record and digital signatures, which would result in citizen friendly digitized record keeping.

7. OFFICIAL RESOLUTION

The following resolution was moved on the 30th December, 2025 by the Rural Development and Panchayats Minister: -

"By scrapping MGNREGA, the BJP central government has taken away the livelihood of Dalit labourers, Dalit families and the poor Dalit community. This is a deliberate and dangerous conspiracy. The BJP central government has not only dismantled MGNREGA, it has also taken away livelihood of Dalit labourers.

This House believes that the BJP central government has not only destroyed a government scheme, it has also destroyed the right to survival of the Dalit labourers of the country. MGNREGA was the last means of survival for millions of Dalits and poor Dalit families in the country. It was the system that allowed Dalit labourers to stay in their villages, earn their livelihood through hard work, send their children to school, and live with dignity. Abolishing MGNREGA is not a decision to implement the scheme, but a declaration of thought from an anti-Dalit perspective. By scrapping MGNREGA, the central BJP government has taken away jobs from Dalit labourers, deprived Dalit children of education, and extinguished the kitchen stoves of Dalit families. A government that extinguishes the kitchen stoves of the Dalit forfeits its moral right to seek votes from the Dalit community. This House clearly states that the policies of the BJP central government are anti-Dalit.

The decisions of BJP's central government repeatedly prove that BJP hates Dalits and wants to marginalize them. Attacking MGNREGA is actually an attack on the dignity and existence of Dalits.

This House also says that the government which does not provide jobs to Dalits in villages pushes them to urban slums. Today, the central BJP government has taken away the moral right of Dalit workers and poor Dalit families to seek votes. A government that does not care about the livelihood of Dalits has no moral demand for Dalit votes.

This House also takes note of the fact that Shiromani Akali Dal (Badal) has maintained silence on this entire issue. This silence is because they hope to re-establish their alliance with the BJP in 2027, even if the Dalits have to pay the price for it. Keeping silent on the verdicts against Dalits is also a crime.

This House therefore recommends that the State Government demand from the BJP Central Government to immediately withdraw the decision to scrap MGNREGA, that MGNREGA be fully restored to its original right-based form, and ensure guaranteed work and wages for Dalit labourers and poor Dalit families across the country. The Punjab Vidhan Sabha stands firmly with Dalits and poor labourers."

The motion was put to the vote of the House and carried unanimously.

The Hon'ble Speaker informed the House about the presence of the famous Jutti (traditional footwear) craftsman of Kotkapura alongwith their art skills in the Members' lounge of the Punjab Vidhan Sabha who were assisted by the Punjab Government under the leadership of the Chief Minister by establishing a Jutti cluster in Kotkpura and also welcomed them on behalf of the entire House.

9. Official Resolution

The following resolution was moved by Sardar Tarunpreet Singh Sond, Minister for the Rural Development and Panchayats in the House and was carried unanimously. He spoke for 07 minutes while presenting the resolution: -

“By scrapping MGNREGA, the BJP central government has taken away the livelihood of Dalit labourers, Dalit families and the poor Dalit community. This is a deliberate and dangerous conspiracy. The BJP central government has not only dismantled MGNREGA, it has also taken away livelihood of Dalit labourers.

This House believes that the BJP central government has not only destroyed a government scheme, it has also destroyed the right to survival of the Dalit labourers of the country. MGNREGA was the last means of survival for millions of Dalits and poor Dalit families in the country. It was the system that allowed Dalit laborers to stay in their villages, earn their livelihood through hard work, send their children to school, and live with dignity. Abolishing MGNREGA is not a decision to implement the scheme, but a declaration of thought from an anti-Dalit perspective. By scrapping MGNREGA, the central BJP government has taken away jobs from Dalit labourers, deprived Dalit children of education, and extinguished the kitchen stoves of Dalit families. A government that extinguishes the kitchen stoves of the Dalit forfeits its moral right to seek votes from the Dalit community. This House clearly states that the policies of the BJP central government are anti-Dalit.

The decisions of BJP's central government repeatedly prove that BJP hates Dalits and wants to marginalize them. Attacking MGNREGA is actually an attack on the dignity and existence of Dalits.

This House also says that the government which does not provide jobs to Dalits in villages pushes them to urban slums. Today, the central BJP government has taken away the moral right of Dalit workers and poor Dalit families to seek votes. A government that does not care about the livelihood of Dalits has no moral demand for Dalit votes.

This House also takes note of the fact that Shiromani Akali Dal (Badal) has maintained silence on this entire issue. This silence is because they hope to re-establish their alliance with the BJP in 2027, even if the Dalits have to pay the price for it. Keeping silent on the verdicts against Dalits is also a crime.

This House therefore recommends that the State Government demand from the BJP Central Government to immediately withdraw the decision to scrap MGNREGA, that MGNREGA be fully restored to its original right-based form, and ensure guaranteed work and wages for Dalit labourers and poor Dalit families across the country. The Punjab Vidhan Sabha stands firmly with Dalits and poor labourers.”
