## 6.SYNOPSIS OF THE BILLS PASSED BY THE VIDHAN SABHA

### 1. **The Punjab Law Officers (Engagement) Amendment Bill, 2025. (Replacing Ordinance) (Introduced and passed on the 5<sup>th</sup> May, 2025)**

This Bill replaces the Punjab Law Officers (Engagement) Amendment Ordinance, 2025 (Punjab Ordinance No. 1 of 2025) which was promulgated to amend Principal Act in order to provide adequate representation to Scheduled Caste candidates as Law Officers in the office of the Advocate General, Punjab by relaxing the criteria of minimal annual professional income.

### 2. **The Rayat Bahra Professional University, Hoshiarpur Bill, 2025 (Introduced and passed on the 11<sup>th</sup> July, 2025)**

This Bill seeks to provide for the greater access and to ensure quality in higher education and to allow the establishment of self-financed Private University to supplement the efforts of the State Universities. The object of the Rayat Bahra Professional University, Hoshiarpur is to impart comprehensive education at all levels to achieve excellence and to promote research and teaching in areas of Engineering, Medical, Paramedical, Sciences, Social sciences, Life Sciences, Humanities, Liberal Arts, Management, E-learning, and Online Education and Training etc.

### 3. **The C.G.C. University, Mohali Bill, 2025 (Introduced and passed on the 11<sup>th</sup> July, 2025)**

This Bill seeks to provide for the greater access and to ensure quality in higher education and to allow the establishment of self-financed Private University to supplement the efforts of the State University. The object of the CGC University Mohali is to impart comprehensive education at all levels to achieve excellence and to promote research and teaching in areas of Engineering, Medical, Paramedical, Sciences, Social sciences, Life sciences, Humanities, Liberal Arts, Management, E-learning, and Online Education and Training etc.

### 4. **The Punjab Shops and Commercial Establishments (Amendment) Bill, 2025 (Introduced and passed on the 11<sup>th</sup> July, 2025)**

This Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act, in order to reduce the burden of regulatory compliances, shops & commercial establishments that employ persons up to 20 by way of making working hours and overtime hours in line with the best practices in present times in order to boost overall productivity.

**5. The Punjab Labour Welfare Fund (Amendment) Bill, 2025  
(Introduced and passed on the 11<sup>th</sup> July, 2025)**

This Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act, in order to improve the financial sources of the Punjab Labour Welfare Board and introduction of Penalties for contraventions and non-compliances for the benefits of needy employers.

**6. The Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (Punjab Amendment) Bill, 2025  
(Introduced and passed on the 11<sup>th</sup> July, 2025)**

This Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act, in order to exempt the conduct of Bullock Cart Racing in Punjab from the provisions of the Central Act 59 of 1960.

**7. The Punjab State Development Tax (Amendment) Bill, 2025  
(Introduced and passed on the 14<sup>th</sup> July, 2025)**

This Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act, in order to make provision for payment of deployment tax on lump sum basis i.e. Rs. 2200/- instead of Rs. 2400/- and to make provisions for One Time Settlement mechanism in the Act.

**8. The Punjab Prevention of Offences Against Holy Scriptures Bill, 2025  
(Introduced on the 14<sup>th</sup> July, 2025 and discussed on 15<sup>th</sup> July, 2025)**

This Bill preserve religious and communal harmony and fraternity among people of diverse religious beliefs and faiths residing in the State of Punjab and to put in place a deterrence to curb incidence of sacrilege of Holy Scriptures and matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

This Bill was Referred to the Select Committee.

**9. The Punjab Appropriation Acts (Repeal) Bill, 2025  
(Introduced and passed on the 14<sup>th</sup> July, 2025)**

This Bill seeks to repeal the several outdated and obsolete laws within the State's Legislative framework.

**10. The Seeds (Punjab Amendment) Bill, 2025  
(Introduced and passed on the 29<sup>th</sup> September, 2025)**

This Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act, so as to prevent sale of sub-standard seeds in order to provide the farmers quality seeds for improvement of productivity. Selling sub-standard seeds is an offence which is cognizable & non-bailable.

**11. The Punjab Right to Business (Amendment) Bill, 2025  
(Introduced and passed on the 29<sup>th</sup> September, 2025)**

This Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act, in order to provide a more comprehensive, efficient and investor-friendly framework, thereby facilitating ease of doing Business in the State as a result the eligible enterprises in approved industrial parks or real estate projects will receive a Certificate of in principle

Approval within five working days and those outside these areas will receive it within 15 days for new enterprises and 18 days for existing ones.

**12. The Punjab Goods and Services Tax (Amendment) Bill, 2025  
(Introduced and passed on the 29<sup>th</sup> September, 2025)**

This Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act, in order to maintain uniformity with the provisions of the Central Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017, as amended by the Finance Act, 2025. These are provisions regarding amendment in definition of Input Service Distributor (ISD) so as to include the distribution of Input Tax Credit (ITC) for inter-State supplies on a reverse charge basis, introduction of "unique identification marking" for certain goods under a track-and-trace mechanism and clarify that "plant and machinery" includes both terms.

**13. The Punjab Apartment and Property Regulation (Amendment) Bill, 2025  
(Introduced and passed on the 29<sup>th</sup> September, 2025)**

This Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act, in order to establish new colonies, granting license for same and for regulation of construction by removing such provisions that causes hardship to stake holders.

**14. The Punjab Co-operative Societies (Amendment) Bill, 2025  
(Introduced and passed on the 29<sup>th</sup> September, 2025)**

This Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act, in order to mandate the formal registration of such instruments. The proposed measures seeks to provide legal clarity, secure ownership rights and minimize property-related disputes. This initiative also aims to withdraw blanket exemptions previously granted to certain classes of societies which will ensure that documentation adheres to property law standards, enhance compliance and improve the integrity of revenue processes resulting in helping augment State revenues.

**15. The Punjab Town Improvement (Amendment) Bill, 2025  
(Introduced and passed on the 29<sup>th</sup> September, 2025)**

This Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act, in order to upgrade municipal infrastructure and improving management of civic services for residents of municipal towns in the State through optimal utilization of resources of Improvement Trusts.

## 8. RESOLUTIONS (OFFICIAL)

The following Resolutions were moved on the 5<sup>th</sup> May, 2025 by the Water Resources Minister: -

"For the past few days, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has been trying to take away the rights of Punjab through its Haryana government, Central Government and BBMB. By calling a meeting in an unconstitutional and illegal manner, an attempt is being made to forcefully provide Punjab's rightful water to Haryana. Haryana has used all its share of water till 31st March. Now BJP wants to give the water of Punjab to Haryana.

During the last three years, Bhagwant Mann Government has tried to bring canal water to every farm in Punjab. A network of canals and water courses has been built on a very large scale. Until 2021, only 22% of Punjab's fields received canal water. But today around 60% of the fields in Punjab are getting canal water. This is why every single drop of Punjab's water has become very precious for Punjab. Punjab no longer has any spare water to give to any other State. Haryana State requested Punjab on April 6, 2025 that they need water for drinking purposes. Punjab showed a big heart and gave 4000 cusecs of water out of its share to Haryana because our Gurus have taught us that giving water to any thirsty person is a great virtue. The population of Haryana is 3 crore and it needs only 1700 cusecs of water to meet all drinking and other human needs but Haryana asked for 4000 cusecs of water from Punjab State and we gave them 4000 cusecs of water as a matter of humanity. Now Haryana is saying that they need 8500 cusecs of water all of a sudden. Punjab does not have extra water to meet their demand. However, BJP forcibly called a meeting of BBMB in an unconstitutional and illegal manner and passed a resolution that Punjab will have to give its water to Haryana from its own share.

This is not acceptable to us.

So, today this House while taking unanimous decision and resolving, recommends that:

1. Government of Punjab will not give even a single drop of water from its share to Haryana. The 4000 cusecs of water that is being given to Haryana for drinking purpose will be continued as a matter of humanity— but not even a drop more will be given.
2. This House strongly condemns the illegal and unconstitutional convening of the BBMB meeting by the Bharatiya Janata Party.
3. At present BBMB has become a mere puppet of the BJP government at the Centre. In the meetings of BBMB neither Punjab is being listened to nor are the rights of Punjab being taken care of. So BBMB should be reorganized so that the rights of Punjab can be protected.

4. Sutlej, Ravi and Beas rivers pass through only Punjab. Then on what basis is their water being given to other States? In 1981, when the agreement to share the water of these rivers was signed between the States, the amount of water in the rivers that was written in the agreement and the amount of water that was distributed amongst States was much more than the actual water now available in these Rivers. Because of this, a new agreement should be made for sharing the water of these rivers.
5. In order to call any meeting of BBMB, the law provides that a notice for minimum number of days is required to be given for each type of meeting but BBMB does not follow this law and convenes illegal meetings at night. This House directs BBMB to follow the law laid down in this regard.
6. Which State will get how much water is clearly written in the 1981 treaty, BBMB has no power to change it. If BBMB gives the share of water of one State to another State by simply convening a meeting, then such decisions of BBMB are illegal and unconstitutional. BBMB should refrain from taking such illegal decisions.
7. This House also considers the Dam Safety Act, 2021 to be an attack on the rights of Punjab. This law fully empowers the central government to directly control the rivers and dams of the States, even if the dam is entirely within the State's borders. This is against India's federal structure and directly undermines the sovereign right of States like Punjab over their water. Therefore, this House demands from the Central Government that the Dam Safety Act, 2021 be repealed immediately and Government of Punjab rejects the Act completely."

**The motion was put to the vote of the House and carried.**

The following Resolution was moved by Shri Barinder Kumar Goyal, Water Resources Minister on the 11<sup>th</sup> July, 2025: -

"1.0 During the past years, the Ministry of Power forwarded a list of vital BBMB installations that were not yet under CISF protection and urged BBMB regarding the need for comprehensive CISF security cover for all critical BBMB sites.

2.0 The State of Punjab has re-examined the issue of deployment of CISF and had already conveyed to BBMB vide letters dated 27/5/2025 and 04/07/2025, expressing its strong reservations against the deployment of the CISF. It is understood that the BBMB is contemplating to go ahead with the deployment of CISF despite strong reservations/objections by the State of Punjab. Even in the last meeting of the BBMB held on 04.07.2025 Punjab had raised its objections very strongly. The deployment of CISF is not acceptable to the State of Punjab for the following reasons:

(i) The installations of the BBMB have been duly protected over the last almost 70 years by the Punjab Police. No such incident has ever come to the notice even during very critical times.

(ii) The State Police posted at the installations is well versed with the local conditions and have been serving the projects for last so many years. As regards technology, Punjab Police is well experienced to use the latest technology. Further, Punjab Police has experience of facing such situations at the Borders also. The force is as professional as any other force in the country.

(iii) The deployment of CISF will increase the unnecessary and avoidable financial burden on the State of Punjab and on other partner States. Punjab being the major contributor to the expenditure of the BBMB, and therefore the State will have to bear this additional expenditure also.

(iv) The installations are within the territorial jurisdiction of Punjab or Himachal Pradesh. It is the duty of the concerned State Government to maintain the law and order and also provide security to these installations within their respective jurisdiction as per law.

(v) As per the recent proposals, the additional financial implication due to deployment of CISF is going to be Rs. 49.32 crore per annum.

(vi) The State of Punjab is also maintaining two other dams namely Ranjit Sagar Dam and Shahpurkandi Dam. The security of these dams is more serious than the BBMB installations as these dams are very near to the international border. The security of these dams is being maintained by the Punjab Police and the State Government.

3.0 In view of the above this House unanimously resolves that:

“(i) The proposal of deployment of CISF personnel by BBMB at all the installations of BBMB is rejected.

(ii) The House strongly affirms that the State Police posted at present are well versed with the condition/territory and security of these projects having served in these areas for many years. The current arrangement has proven efficient and cost-effective, with no significant security lapses reported. Hence the State of Punjab does not agree with the deployment of CISF at Bhakra Nangal Project.

(iii) The Hybrid model of deployment of CISF implies a significant cost differential i.e. over Rs. 49.32 Crores higher than existing state police deployment which is not acceptable to the State of Punjab.

(iv) Punjab is a major stakeholder in the BBMB and contributes significantly to its funding Therefore the deployment of CISF personnel at the Bhakra Nangal and other hydro Projects would impose an unnecessary and avoidable financial burden on the Punjab Government.

(v) If BBMB still intends to proceed with the deployment of CISF personnel, Punjab will not bear any financial burden arising from such deployment.”

4.0 In view of the above, the House unanimously recommends to the Government of Punjab that the matter be taken up with the Government of India with the concerned Ministries and request Government of India and BBMB not to deploy the CISF Personnel at Bhakra Dam Projects and other Hydro Projects of BBMB."

**The motion was carried unanimously.**

The following Resolution was moved by Shri Barinder Kumar Goyal, Water Resources Minister on the 26<sup>th</sup> September, 2025: -

"WHEREAS, the State of Punjab has been ravaged by catastrophic floods, widely regarded as the worst and most destructive deluge since the 1988 floods which historically impacted over 34 lakh people;

AND WHEREAS, the current disaster has surpassed previous major flood events in independent India, such as those in 1955 and 1978, in terms of sheer scale and devastation, causing loss to over 20 lakh people in many ways, destroying crops on nearly 5 lakh acres, numerous loss to livestock, and irreparable damage to both private and public infrastructure;

AND WHEREAS, the Chief Minister of Punjab, after a comprehensive assessment, formally demanded a special and substantial financial relief package of at least Rs 20,000 Crore from the Union Government, led by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), to meet this unprecedented crisis;

AND WHEREAS, the State Government, with deep regret, must inform this House and the people of Punjab that even a part of the meagre announced package of Rs 1,600 Crore has not yet been transferred to the State Treasury;

AND WHEREAS, the Prime Minister's Office has not responded to the elected Chief Minister of Punjab's repeated request for a meeting, and by limiting interaction to selected individuals, has prevented Punjab from making a proper and comprehensive representation through its Chief Minister;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this House—the Punjab Vidhan Sabha:

1. Categorically condemns the lack of response and the failure of the BJP-led Union Government to sanction a special financial package commensurate with the scale of the worst floods faced by Punjab in decades.

2. Records its strongest condemnation of the Prime Minister's Office for not responding to the elected Chief Minister of Punjab's repeated request for a meeting, thereby insulting the people of the State, and preventing the State from making a proper and comprehensive representation of the full scale of the disaster.

3. Expresses its profound dismay at the announcement of a token relief package of Rs 1,600 Crore, which is a cruel mockery of the State's genuine demand of over Rs 20,000 Crore for a full recovery.

4. Records its strong protest against the BJP led Union Government's apathy that has resulted in the non-disbursement of the announced token funds, thereby critically crippling the speed of the State Government's ongoing relief and rehabilitation operations.

5. Urgently calls upon the Union Government to acknowledge the gravity of this disaster, revisit the assessed damages, and sanction a comprehensive and substantially enhanced special financial package of not less than Rs 20,000 Crore to support the farmers, rebuild the ruined infrastructure, and restore the livelihoods of the people of Punjab, and demands the immediate and full transfer of the entire announced financial assistance of Rs 1,600 Crore to the State of Punjab.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution, after its adoption by the Punjab Vidhan Sabha, shall be officially transmitted to the Hon'ble Prime

Minister, the Hon'ble Union Home Minister, and the Ministry of Finance, Government of India, for their immediate and decisive action."

## **18. RULINGS BY THE HON'BLE SPEAKER**

The Hon'ble Speaker gave the following Rulings on 11.07.2025: -

1. I request both the treasury benches and the Opposition Benches that for me, you both are equal. We have been sent to this august House by the people of Punjab to solve the problems of Punjab, to deliberate on them. I request that the functioning of this House is governed by certain rules and regulations and we must work according to these rules. You are free to speak on behalf of your respective parties, but in this House, I expect that we prioritize Punjab in our discussions. We are answerable to three crores people of Punjab and also to Punjabis around the world. These two days have been extended so that all of you may present your views. Whatever issues, concerned with the people of Punjab, that you wish to raise in this House, you will be given an opportunity to do so.
2. I request all respected Members that if anyone requires a video of the proceedings of the House, it will be provided to them. No one should make a video while sitting here. If anyone has made, then it should be deleted.
3. When the Hon'ble Chief Minister stands up to speak in the House, no other Member should stand up.

-----

## 19. OBSERVATIONS BY THE HON'BLE SPEAKER

1. The Hon'ble Speaker made the following Observations on 05.05.2025: -

1. Our history itself is a witness that although the Misls (ਮਿਸਲਾਂ) used to fight among themselves but whenever an external force attacked, we would unite and confront them together. Even today, I have this hope from the House that this is not a matter of endurance but a matter of apprehension. In a way, this is an attack on our federal structure also. So we should come together and fight this battle unitedly.
2. I want to put it on record that a section of the media is demonizing Punjab, which should not happen. I believe that today we will be successful in presenting all facts of Punjab before this august House. I would like to make a request that 36% of rice from Punjab goes into our country's national pool and 47% of the wheat from Punjab goes into our country's national pool. So the water that we use here is used to feed the people of the country. We don't use it for any other purpose. These are the Punjabis who made one million sacrifices when our country gained independence. So the perspective of Punjabis should also be equally represented in the media.

2. The Hon'ble Speaker made the following Observations on 29.09.2025: -

1. "I respectfully request all the honorable Members that this is very precious time, the people of Punjab have sent us here with great hopes and expectations. I humbly request that we must not repeat anything, if we keep on repeating the same thing, it doesn't serve any useful purpose. We can make a video and play it, what is the benefit of that. If you have been elected as an MLA, then everything is fine, people have entrusted you with such a great responsibility that obviously the video will be made on its own. If there is something different, something new, something for the welfare of Punjab, then we must certainly present it here."

In this House, we have been elected and sent by the people of Punjab with great hopes and expectations, with the belief that whatever our representatives discuss here will shape our future and strengthen our destiny. Whenever we indulge in such debates here and the pandemonium carries beyond

this House, it appears to me that we fall short of fulfilling the hopes and expectations of the people of Punjab. The people listen and watch us with great hope. Therefore, I respectfully request all Members of this House that whenever any Member is speaking, we must let him speak. You may give your response in due course. If we interrupt, nothing productive comes out of the interruption, but in this way, people's hearts are broken. The people of Punjab have already suffered many disappointments and we must not break hearts any more. We must now nurture their hearts and lead them forward. Punjab has already suffered many losses. Every Member is given the opportunity to respond, this will continue to be ensured in the future as well."

3. "This House is very precious and an august House. We must sit seriously in the House. If we engage in casual talks, then it must be carried outside. Three crore people of Punjab are watching us and they are observing us with keen interest and high expectations. Therefore, a sense of seriousness must be evident here. Moreover, there are several rules governing conduct and deliberation in the House, we must adhere to those rules diligently. There are several such rules which many Members, including senior Members do violate. If violation of these rules are formally noted, then strict action can be taken upon.

Therefore, I believe that all the Hon'ble Members must uphold and maintain decorum of the House. The conduct regarding entry and exit within the House must be diligently observed and properly maintained at all times. If we maintain the decorum of the House, the people of Punjab will be pleased, knowing that we have been rightly elected and sent here. Therefore, we must uphold the dignity and values of the House, as well as the trust of the public."

4. "I would like to share an interaction from my side that when the GST Bill was presented in this House (while pointing towards the opposition benches) we were seated on this side and at that moment (while pointing towards the treasury benches) the then Finance Minister, while speaking, remarked that it is rare in the history of the House for such an important Bill to be introduced.

It is my observation that not only Punjab, but all the States too have faced consequences. The implementation of this Bill has adversely affected small businessmen. The nation and the poor have been adversely affected. A detailed and comprehensive discussion on this matter is therefore essential.

Along with this, I wish to address the Parliamentary Affairs Minister that our concerned officials should not be punished but they must be provided with appropriate guidance and direction. You should explore whether the Bill as per Rules/Act can be submitted 15 days in advance, if any officer brings the Bill in advance, they should be commended, promoted or rewarded with an increment. This is very important, as any matter or Bills that are passed in the Assembly without allowing Members sufficient opportunity for discussion may still serve the public interest but I feel that if the Members are provided with the Bill in advance and discussions are conducted with proper preparation, the chances of achieving beneficial results will increase further. Henceforth, a mechanism should be established so that the Bills that can be introduced at the earliest, the better it will be. It has to be submitted 15 days earlier as per provision."

5. "Today I express my satisfaction in this regard. I also convey my gratitude that whenever discussion takes place, particularly in Speaker Conferences, a consistent emphasis is placed on the principle that the Legislature has been the most powerful institution in the democracy. The Judiciary functions as an independent authority in the democracy. The Executive is also independent, but the power it exercises is derived from the Legislature. At present, the volume of amendments has reached to such an extent that the importance of the Legislature is gradually diminishing. The situation arose as a consequence of the absence of discussion on the Bills. This is not a matter confined to a single State, but the same trend is prevailing throughout India. So today I express my satisfaction on your participation in this discussion and believe that today we are ensuring due justice to this Chair. Today we are doing justice to the people who have sent us in this House."

The Secretary laid on the table of the House a statement showing the details of the Bills passed by the 16<sup>th</sup> Punjab Vidhan Sabha during its 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> (Budget) Session, which have since been assented to by the Hon'ble President/Governor.

### **4. Motion Under Rule 16**

The following motion moved by the Parliamentary Affairs Minister was put to the vote of the House and carried-

"That the Vidhan Sabha (Assembly) at its rising this day shall stand adjourned sine- die."

### **5. Papers laid on the Table**

The Parliamentary Affairs Minister laid papers on the table of the House as mentioned at serial no. 1 and 2 as shown under item no. 4 in the List of Business.

### **6. Welcome Announcement by the Hon'ble Speaker**

The Hon'ble Speaker informed the House regarding the presence of Hon'ble Members of the Lok Sabha Sardar Malvinder Singh Kang, Shri Gurmeet Singh Meet Haheer and Sardar Amrinder Singh Raja Warring in the House and welcomed them on behalf of the entire House.

### **7. Official Resolution**

The following Resolution moved by Shri Barinder Kumar Goyal, Water Resources Minister was put to the vote of House and carried unanimously :-

" For the past few days, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has been trying to take away the rights of Punjab through its Haryana government, Central Government and BBMB. By calling a meeting in an unconstitutional and illegal manner, an attempt is being made to forcefully provide Punjab's rightful water to Haryana. Haryana has used all its share of water till 31st March. Now BJP wants to give the water of Punjab to Haryana.

During the last three years, Bhagwant Mann government has tried to bring canal water to every farm in Punjab. A network of canals and water courses has been built on a very large scale. Until 2021, only 22% of Punjab's fields received canal water. But today around 60% of the fields in Punjab are getting canal water. This is why every single drop of Punjab's water has

become very precious for Punjab. Punjab no longer has any spare water to give to any other State. Haryana State requested Punjab on April 6, 2025 that they need water for drinking purposes. Punjab showed a big heart and gave 4000 cusecs of water out of its share to Haryana because our Gurus have taught us that giving water to any thirsty person is a great virtue. The population of Haryana is 3 crore and it needs only 1700 cusecs of water to meet all drinking and other human needs but Haryana asked for 4000 cusecs of water from Punjab State and we gave them 4000 cusecs of water as a matter of humanity. Now Haryana is saying that they need 8500 cusecs of water all of a sudden. Punjab does not have extra water to meet their demand. However, BJP forcibly called a meeting of BBMB in an unconstitutional and illegal manner and passed a resolution that Punjab will have to give its water to Haryana from its own share.

This is not acceptable to us.

So, today this House while taking unanimous decision and resolving, recommends that:

1. Government of Punjab will not give even a single drop of water from its share to Haryana. The 4000 cusecs of water that is being given to Haryana for drinking purpose will be continued as a matter of humanity—but not even a drop more will be given.
2. This House strongly condemns the illegal and unconstitutional convening of the BBMB meeting by the Bharatiya Janata Party.
3. At present BBMB has become a mere puppet of the BJP government at the Centre. In the meetings of BBMB neither Punjab is being listened to nor are the rights of Punjab being taken care of. So BBMB should be reorganized so that the rights of Punjab can be protected.
4. Sutlej, Ravi and Beas rivers pass through only Punjab. Then on what basis is their water being given to other States? In 1981, when the agreement to share the water of these rivers was signed between the States, the amount of water in the rivers that was written in the agreement and the amount of water that was distributed amongst States was much more than the actual water now available in these Rivers. Because of this, a new agreement should be made for sharing the water of these rivers.
5. In order to call any meeting of BBMB, the law provides that a notice for minimum number of days is required to be given for each type of meeting but BBMB does not follow this law and convenes illegal meetings at night. This House directs BBMB to follow the law laid down in this regard.
6. Which State will get how much water is clearly written in the 1981 treaty, BBMB has no power to change it. If BBMB gives the share of water of one State to another State by simply convening a meeting, then such

decisions of BBMB are illegal and unconstitutional. BBMB should refrain from taking such illegal decisions.

7. This House also considers the Dam Safety Act, 2021 to be an attack on the rights of Punjab. This law fully empowers the central government to directly control the rivers and dams of the States, even if the dam is entirely within the State's borders. This is against India's federal structure and directly undermines the sovereign right of States like Punjab over their water. Therefore, this House demands from the Central Government that the Dam Safety Act, 2021 be repealed immediately and Government of Punjab rejects the Act completely."

These are the Punjabis who made one million sacrifices when our country gained independence. So the perspective of Punjabis should also be equally represented in the media.

**3. Ruling by the Hon'ble Speaker**

The Hon'ble Speaker gave the following rulings: -

1. I request both the treasury benches and the Opposition Benches that for me, you both are equal. We have been sent to this august House by the people of Punjab to solve the problems of Punjab, to deliberate on them. I request that the functioning of this House is governed by certain rules and regulations and we must work according to these rules. You are free to speak on behalf of your respective parties, but in this House, I expect that we prioritize Punjab in our discussions. We are answerable to three crores people of Punjab and also to Punjabis around the world. These two days have been extended so that all of you may present your views. Whatever issues, concerned with the people of Punjab, that you wish to raise in this House, you will be given an opportunity to do so.
2. I request all respected Members that if anyone requires a video of the proceedings of the House, it will be provided to them. No one should make a video while sitting here. If anyone has made, then it should be deleted.

3. When the Hon'ble Chief Minister stands up to speak in the House, no other Member should stand up.

#### **4. First report of the Business Advisory Committee**

The Hon'ble Speaker presented the First Report of the Business Advisory Committee in the House regarding the business to be transacted by the Punjab Vidhan Sabha from 11.07.2025 to 15.07.2025.

The following motion moved by the Parliamentary Affairs Minister was put to the vote of the House and carried: -

"That this House agrees with the recommendations contained in the First Report of the Business Advisory Committee."

#### **6. Official Resolution**

The following resolution moved by Shri Barinder Kumar Goyal, Water Resources Minister was put to the vote of the House and carried unanimously.

"1.0 During the past years, the Ministry of Power forwarded a list of vital BBMB installations that were not yet under CISF protection and urged BBMB regarding the need for comprehensive CISF security cover for all critical BBMB sites.

2.0 The State of Punjab has re-examined the issue of deployment of CISF and had already conveyed to BBMB vide letters dated 27/5/2025 and 04/07/2025, expressing its strong reservations against the deployment of the CISF. It is understood that the BBMB is contemplating to go ahead with the deployment of CISF despite strong reservations/objections by the State of Punjab. Even in the last meeting of the BBMB held on 04.07.2025 Punjab had raised its objections very strongly. The deployment of CISF is not acceptable to the State of Punjab for the following reasons:

(i) The installations of the BBMB have been duly protected over the last almost 70 years by the Punjab Police. No such incident has ever come to the notice even during very critical times.

(ii) The State Police posted at the installations is well versed with the local conditions and have been serving the projects for last so many years. As regards technology, Punjab Police is well experienced to use the latest technology. Further, Punjab Police has experience of facing such situations at the Borders also. The force is as professional as any other force in the country.

(iii) The deployment of CISF will increase the unnecessary and avoidable financial burden on the State of Punjab and on other partner States. Punjab being the major contributor to the expenditure of the BBMB, and therefore the State will have to bear this additional expenditure also.

(iv) The installations are within the territorial jurisdiction of Punjab or Himachal Pradesh. It is the duty of the concerned State Government to maintain the law and order and also provide security to these installations within their respective jurisdiction as per law.

(v) As per the recent proposals, the additional financial implication due to deployment of CISF is going to be Rs. 49.32 crore per annum.

(vi) The State of Punjab is also maintaining two other dams namely Ranjit Sagar Dam and Shahpurkandi Dam. The security of these dams is more serious than the BBMB installations as these dams are very near to the international border. The security of these dams is being maintained by the Punjab Police and the State Government.

3.0 In view of the above this House unanimously resolves that:

“(i) The proposal of deployment of CISF personnel by BBMB at all the installations of BBMB is rejected.

(ii) The House strongly affirms that the State Police posted at present are well versed with the condition/territory and security of these projects having served in these areas for many years. The current arrangement has proven efficient and cost-effective, with no significant security lapses reported. Hence the State of Punjab does not agree with the deployment of CISF at Bhakra Nangal Project.

(iii) The Hybrid model of deployment of CISF implies a significant cost differential i.e. over Rs. 49.32 Crores higher than existing state police deployment which is not acceptable to the State of Punjab.

(iv) Punjab is a major stakeholder in the BBMB and contributes significantly to its funding Therefore the deployment of CISF personnel at the Bhakra Nangal and other hydro Projects would impose an unnecessary and avoidable financial burden on the Punjab Government.

(v) If BBMB still intends to proceed with the deployment of CISF personnel, Punjab will not bear any financial burden arising from such deployment.”

4.0 In view of the above, the House unanimously recommends to the Government of Punjab that the matter be taken up with the Government of India with the concerned Ministries and request Government of India and BBMB not to deploy the CISF Personnel at Bhakra Dam Projects and other Hydro Projects of BBMB."

"The Punjab Prevention of offences against Holy Scriptures Bill, 2025 be referred to Select Committee, to be constituted by the Speaker and the Select Committee may submit its report within six months after taking opinion of the people."

**(2) Official Resolution**

AND WHEREAS, the Chief Minister of Punjab, after a comprehensive assessment, formally demanded a special and substantial financial relief package of at least Rs 20,000 Crore from the Union Government, led by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), to meet this unprecedented crisis;

AND WHEREAS, the State Government, with deep regret, must inform this House and the people of Punjab that even a part of the meagre announced package of Rs 1,600 Crore has not yet been transferred to the State Treasury;

AND WHEREAS, the Prime Minister's Office has not responded to the elected Chief Minister of Punjab's repeated request for a meeting, and by limiting interaction to selected individuals, has prevented Punjab from making a proper and comprehensive representation through its Chief Minister;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this House—the Punjab Vidhan Sabha:

1. Categorically condemns the lack of response and the failure of the BJP-led Union Government to sanction a special financial package

commensurate with the scale of the worst floods faced by Punjab in decades.

2. Records its strongest condemnation of the Prime Minister's Office for not responding to the elected Chief Minister of Punjab's repeated request for a meeting, thereby insulting the people of the State, and preventing the State from making a proper and comprehensive representation of the full scale of the disaster.

After a lengthy debate between Sardar Partap Singh Bajwa, Leader of the opposition and Sardar Harpal Singh Cheema, Finance Minister, the House was adjourned for 10 Minutes by the Hon'ble Speaker following the interruptions caused by discussion between Members of the Aam Aadmi Party and Members of the Indian National Congress.

#### **5. Welcome Announcement by the Hon'ble Speaker**

1. The Hon'ble Speaker informed the House about the presence of school students of Baba Farid Public School, Faridkot and Major Ajaib Singh Convent School, Jeonwala, Faridkot in the House and welcomed them on behalf of the entire House.
2. The Hon'ble Speaker informed the House about the presence of Aasha workers from Kotkapura in the House and welcomed them on behalf of the entire House.
3. The Hon'ble Speaker informed the House about the presence of Hon'ble Union Minister of State for Railways, Sardar Ravneet Singh in the Governor box and Shri Babu Singh Maan, Lyricist and Writer of folk songs in the House and welcomed them on behalf of the entire House.

#### **6. Observation by the Hon'ble Speaker**

The Hon'ble Speaker made the following observations: -

1. "I respectfully request all the honorable Members that this is very precious time, the people of Punjab have sent us here with great hopes and expectations. I humbly request that we must not repeat anything, if we keep on repeating the same thing, it doesn't serve any useful purpose. We can make a video and play it, what is the benefit of that. If you have been elected as an MLA, then everything is fine, people have entrusted you with such a great responsibility that obviously the video will be made on its own. If there is something different, something new, something for the welfare of Punjab, then we must certainly present it here."

2. ਰੇਸ਼ੁ ਨ ਕੀਜੈ ਉਤਰੁ ਦੀਜੈ। "This is an august House. In this House, we have been elected and sent by the people of Punjab with great hopes and expectations, with the belief that whatever our representatives discuss here will shape our future and strengthen our destiny. Whenever we indulge in such debates here and the pandemonium carries beyond this House, it appears to me that we fall short of fulfilling the hopes and expectations of the people of Punjab. The people listen and watch us with great hope. Therefore, I respectfully request all Members of this House that whenever any Member is speaking, we must let him speak. You may give your response in due course. If we interrupt, nothing productive comes out of the interruption, but in this way, people's hearts are broken. The people of Punjab have already suffered many disappointments and we must not break hearts any more. We must now nurture their hearts and lead them forward. Punjab has already suffered many losses. Every Member is given the opportunity to respond, this will continue to be ensured in the future as well."

3. "This House is very precious and an august House. We must sit seriously in the House. If we engage in casual talks, then it must be carried outside. Three crore people of Punjab are watching us and they are observing us with keen interest and high expectations. Therefore, a sense of seriousness must be evident here. Moreover, there are several rules governing conduct and deliberation in the House, we must adhere to those rules diligently. There are several such rules which many Members, including senior Members do violate. If violation of these rules are formally noted, then strict action can be taken upon.

Therefore, I believe that all the Hon'ble Members must uphold and maintain decorum of the House. The conduct regarding entry and exit within the House must be diligently observed and properly maintained at all times. If we maintain the decorum of the House, the people of Punjab will be pleased, knowing that we have been rightly elected and sent here. Therefore, we must uphold the dignity and values of the House, as well as the trust of the public."

4. "I would like to share an interaction from my side that when the GST Bill was presented in this House (while pointing towards the opposition benches) we were seated on this side and at that moment (while

pointing towards the treasury benches) the then Finance Minister, while speaking, remarked that it is rare in the history of the House for such an important Bill to be introduced.

It is my observation that not only Punjab, but all the States too have faced consequences. The implementation of this Bill has adversely affected small businessmen. The nation and the poor have been adversely affected. A detailed and comprehensive discussion on this matter is therefore essential.

Along with this, I wish to address the Parliamentary Affairs Minister that our concerned officials should not be punished but they must be provided with appropriate guidance and direction. You should explore whether the Bill as per Rules/Act can be submitted 15 days in advance, if any officer brings the Bill in advance, they should be commended, promoted or rewarded with an increment. This is very important, as any matter or Bills that are passed in the Assembly without allowing Members sufficient opportunity for discussion may still serve the public interest but I feel that if the Members are provided with the Bill in advance and discussions are conducted with proper preparation, the chances of achieving beneficial results will increase further. Henceforth, a mechanism should be established so that the Bills that can be introduced at the earliest, the better it will be. It has to be submitted 15 days earlier as per provision."

5. "Today I express my satisfaction in this regard. I also convey my gratitude that whenever discussion takes place, particularly in Speaker Conferences, a consistent emphasis is placed on the principle that the Legislature has been the most powerful institution in the democracy. The Judiciary functions as an independent authority in the democracy. The Executive is also independent, but the power it exercises is derived from the Legislature. At present, the volume of amendments has reached to such an extent that the importance of the Legislature is gradually diminishing. The situation arose as a consequence of the absence of discussion on the Bills. This is not a matter confined to a single State, but the same trend is prevailing throughout India. So today I express my satisfaction on your participation in this discussion and believe that today we are ensuring due justice to this Chair. Today we are doing justice to the people who have sent us in this House."
